Minutes for June 25, 2025

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 PM by President Bob McGovern. He then led the membership in the Pledge of Allegiance followed by a moment of silence and prayer.

Community police officer Anthony Battista spoke:

- There were 112 investigations in our area – all of these investigations were at businesses only – people trying to break in and rob them. No home issues.
- There were 2 motor vehicle theft attempts.
- Complaints were voiced about people speeding up and down East Mountain Rd. and the blight issue on that road – waiting on new cameras to be installed that will hopefully cut down on the dumping issue

Alderman Jeff Hunter introduced himself and reminded us that if we needed anything to get in touch with him

Mike DiGiovancarlo spoke:

- Blasting will start soon on the Split Rock Rd. area project
- If the music is too loud in the neighborhood at any time of day, please call to report
- Red light cameras are in the process of being installed
- The New York marker plates on cars continue to be an out-of-control problem; the city is starting to clamp down
- The East Mt. development on Rt. 69 still has many problems. One is the school bus issue. It looks like the next meeting will be pushed until August. If the proposal is vetoed, it will go to court. But there is a good chance this project may not happen. It is very important for residents to still voice their concerns.

The East Mountain Grant Scholarship was awarded to a Crosby High student. – Pedro Pagan Jr. He was not able to attend but sent a thank you letter.

Mike Stere gave a report on the Waterbury Neighborhood Council:

- The council awarded three (3) scholarships citywide
